2026/27 UNIFORM POLICY

Rationale: The development of a uniform policy is driven by a desire to create and promote an environment of learning where dress is not a distraction to the educational process based on the following principles:

1. We aim to honor God in all we do, acknowledging the Lordship of Jesus Christ in our choices.
2. All human actions, including outward manifestations such as clothing, reveal and communicate the disposition of the heart at some level. We desire to address these heart issues in one uniform policy rather than seeking to anticipate and curb the numerous manifestations of it that surface throughout the year with a looser dress code.
3. Clothing represents the vocational calling of a person, and inherent in the uniform policy is a desire to create an environment where children can thrive in their vocational calling as students. The neat appearance created by a uniform enhances a ready-to-learn atmosphere.
4. Uniforms help engender a cohesive presentation of the students in our school. When our students are in uniform, it communicates, aesthetically, that they are part of the same team, working toward the same goals. The student is part of a group identity that strives for excellence, and the code establishes a tradition toward that end.
5. The uniform code should save parents money. The use of uniforms de-emphasizes the social impact of dress and helps focus the students on character and academic issues.
6. The uniform code addresses security. While on campus, both on the playground and in the school building, teachers and staff can quickly identify students from outsiders. On field trips, students in uniform aid teachers in keeping track of everyone.

The first uniform check should be done by parents at home before leaving for school. Students are expected to be in uniform while on campus unless specified otherwise by the administration. The administration is responsible for defining the policy. Enforcing the policy is the collective responsibility of parents, administration, and staff.

CCS STANDARD UNIFORM: Monday/Tuesday/Wednesday

GENTLEMEN: STANDARD UNIFORM

Pants	Khaki or navy pants
Shorts	Khaki or navy shorts
Shirts	Navy, light blue, or white, short or long-sleeved polo. CCS logo optional for navy and white polos. CCS logo mandatory for light blue polos.
Tie	None
Sweater/Vest	Navy fleece jacket or fleece ¼ zip with CCS logo. CCS logo optional for plain navy pullover or sweater
Shoes	Athletic shoes: low-top, white, navy, black, or neutral (gray, beige, brown) Casual shoes: white, navy, black, or neutral (gray, beige, brown)
Belt	Brown, navy, or black belt every day required 1 st grade and older
Socks	Plain white or navy

LADIES: STANDARD UNIFORM

Pants	Khaki or navy pants
Shorts	Khaki or navy shorts
Skirts/skorts	Clear Blue Plaid skirt (with neutral or black cartwheel shorts underneath) or khaki or navy skort
Shirts	Navy, light blue, or white, short or long-sleeved polo. CCS logo encouraged.
Jumper	Clear Blue Plaid jumper (with navy or white cartwheel shorts underneath)
Dress	Navy or light blue, long or short-sleeved polo dress with CCS logo (with neutral or black cartwheel shorts, tights or leggings underneath)
Sweater/Vest	Navy fleece jacket or fleece ¼ zip with CCS logo. CCS logo optional for plain navy pullover, sweater, or cardigan
Shoes	Athletic shoes: low top, white, navy, black, or neutral (gray, beige, brown) Casual shoes: white, navy, black, or neutral (gray, beige, brown) Boots: Classic black booties
Socks/tights	Plain white or navy socks. Navy or white tights or fitted leggings may be worn under skirt, skort, dress or jumper

CCS: THURSDAY DRESS UNIFORM

GENTLEMEN: DRESS UNIFORM

Pants	Khaki pants
Shorts	Khaki shorts may be worn in August, September, and May
Shirts	White collared Oxford button-down long or short-sleeved shirt
Tie	Clear Blue Plaid tie
Sweater/Vest	Navy blue sweater vest
Shoes	Black, brown or navy dress shoes
Belt	Brown, navy, or black belt required 1 st grade and older
Socks	Plain white or navy socks

LADIES: DRESS UNIFORM

Pants	No pants
Shorts	No shorts
Skirt/skort	Clear Blue Plaid skort
Shirts	White Oxford button-down long or short-sleeved blouse
Jumper	Clear Blue Plaid jumper (with navy or white cartwheel shorts underneath)
Sweater/Vest	Navy blue sweater vest if wearing skirt/skort
Shoes	Conservative black or navy dress shoes
Socks/Tights	Plain white or navy socks or tights.

CCS: UNIFORM CLARIFICATIONS

1. Clean and Tidy: Inherent in the uniform policy is an assumption that when students arrive at school, all clothing and shoes will be clean. CCS Staff will support students throughout the day in keeping a tidy appearance while in uniform: shirts tucked in, ties straight, etc.
2. Skirts: Skirt must touch the top of the knee, and/or reach the finger tips of the students.
3. Belts: Gentlemen 1st grade up must wear a belt with pants every day: brown, navy, or black.
4. Shirts: must be always tucked in.
5. Shorts: Khaki shorts may be worn all year on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays. Shorts must reach the middle of the thigh (no short shorts). Shorts may be worn on Thursdays in August, September and May.
6. Jackets/Sweaters: Non-uniform Jackets and sweaters may not be worn in the classroom. A CCS embroidered fleece may be worn as needed.
7. Sweatshirts: Hooded sweatshirts are never permitted inside the school building with any school uniform, even with a CCS logo.
8. Socks/Tights: Socks must always be worn and must show outside the shoe.
9. Leggings: Ladies may wear white or navy fitted leggings under skirt, skort, dress or jumper on standard uniform days. Leggings should not be baggy.
10. Shoes: Any colors specified in the guidelines. Soles must be smaller than 1 inch. No hightops.
11. Dress shoes: Dress shoes should be low heeled, conservative, traditional, and of a higher standard of style than regular or athletic shoes. No lug soles, boots, platform or wedge shoes.
12. Boots: Snow or rain boots may only be worn to school and during recess and lunch on rainy/snowy days or when snow is on the ground, but not on other occasions; students must bring their regular uniform shoes to change into for the school day. Conservative black booties are acceptable for standard dress days for girls.
13. Jewelry: Must be neutral tone, silver, gold. No colorful pieces. No bracelets or rings for Grammar School students.
14. Makeup: Makeup is prohibited for grammar school students. Logic school girls may wear minimal natural looking makeup and neutral nail color.
15. Artificial Nails: Artificial nails are prohibited for grammar students. Logic students may wear artificial nails at a modest length.
16. Watches: Any watch that sends or receives data is not allowed. Regular watches must be school colors: white, navy, black, or neutral (gray, beige, brown)

CCS: UNIFORM EXCLUSIONS

Items that are never permitted:

- Embroidery (other than CCS logo)
- Sandals
- Corduroy
- Denim
- Capris
- Hoodie sweatshirts
- Cargo pants/shorts
- Hats
- Scarves
- Bandanas
- Lace
- Hair ties, scrunchies, bows that are not CCS color scheme
- Ruffles
- Dyed or unkempt hair
- Additional piercings or multiple earrings in the same ear
- Men's earrings
- Torn or soiled clothes
- Overdone make-up, jewelry, or hair accessories
- Tattoos
- Immodesty
- Visible undergarments or camisoles
- Over- or under-sized clothing
- Long hair, shaved stripes, mullets, hair hanging into the eyes, or any nontraditional hairstyles, haircuts, or hair coloring for men; nontraditional hairstyles, haircuts.
- Smart Watch

UNIFORM VIOLATIONS & POLICY ENFORCEMENT

For any missing or incorrect uniform item, students will receive a Uniform Violation Slip which will be sent home. Students may receive two orange violation slips without consequence. **Upon receiving the third orange Uniform Violation Slip (whenever that occurs during the academic year), students will be sent to the office to wait until a parent brings the missing uniform item. Parents are encouraged to come as quickly as possible, as students will not be allowed to return to class until they are dressed properly.**

QUESTIONS

ANSWERS

LADIES	
Is it OK for ladies to wear colored hair accessories?	If they are within CCS color scheme.
Do ladies have to tuck all shirts in, regardless of the cut?	Yes.
My daughter has a pretty camisole that she wears under her blouse for modesty purposes. Should it be tucked in?	Yes, it should. Camisoles and undershirts are considered undergarments, and they must be out of sight.
What kind of jewelry is appropriate for my daughter?	Small earrings on the lobe are fine. Earrings around the top of the ear or anywhere else are inappropriate. A feminine necklace is acceptable. Grammar school girls should not wear rings or bracelets.
May my daughter cut her hair in a boys' style, shave all her head, or shave one side of her head, etc.?	No. While women may have discretion and variety in their hair styles and hair lengths, all styles and lengths must be feminine and not androgynous at school.
GENTLEMEN	
How long must my son's hair be to qualify as long hair?	If a gentleman's hair is below the middle of his collar, hanging down in his eyes, gathering in a large tuft over the forehead, or covering the sides of his ears, it will be considered too long.
My son likes non-traditional haircuts, such as a shaved head, one side shaved, shaved stripes, mullets, or mohawks. Are these OK?	No. Haircuts and hairstyles must be generally traditional and conservative during the school year.
My son doesn't like to comb his hair, and I don't have time to do it for him. Is this OK?	No. All students should come to school with their hair combed and otherwise looking well-groomed.
My son wears his oxford and tie with the top button undone and the tie loose. Is that OK?	No. Ties should be tight, and buttons buttoned.
May my son roll up his long-sleeved dress shirt?	No, but men may choose to wear a button-down short-sleeved shirt instead.

Does my son's tie have to fit?	Yes, all ties must fit. The wide bottom of the tie should come down to the belt, and the collar of the tie should be snug around the neck.
My son only has two pairs of his uniform, and I only do laundry once a week. Is it OK for him to come to school in a worn polo or oxford?	No. All students should come to school in uniforms that look clean.
My son says that dark no-show or low-cut socks qualify as dress socks. Is that true?	No, it isn't.
My son likes to wear a necklace. Is that OK?	Yes, as long as it is not visible.
My son likes to wear orange T-shirts under his uniform shirt. Is that OK?	No. T-shirts and camisoles must be white.
GENERAL	
Does my daughter or son have to wear deodorant?	Only if they have body odor, which is unpleasant for teachers and classmates to experience in a closed environment.
My kids like to dye or color their hair. Is this OK?	No. Students may not color or dye their hair during the school year.
My kids like to wear moccasins or hiking boots or high-tops to school. Do these qualify as appropriate shoes?	No, they don't. However, students may wear boots to school on rainy days or when there is snow on the ground.
Is it alright to wear a sweater without a blouse or polo underneath?	No, it isn't.
May my student wear cowboy boots with their uniform?	No, they may not.
My student runs cold. Is a thermal layer worn under a long-sleeved blouse or long-sleeve polo appropriate?	Yes, if it is the same color as the blouse or polo and is not visible.
